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## Freshmen and Sophomores

**Quarterly meetings recommended**  
**\$125 per meeting**

- Academic planning – advice on scheduling classes at school.
  - Academic accountability and study skills.
  - Explore career path interests.
  - Locate volunteer opportunities to become a leader within the community.
  - Learn about summer programs and qualifications.
  - Begin looking at standardized testing options – PSAT, ACT, and SAT.
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## Juniors

**Monthly or every other month meetings recommended – minimum 4 meetings**  
**\$150 per meeting**

- Academic planning – advice on scheduling classes at school.
  - Academic accountability and study skills.
  - Explore career path interests.
  - Locate volunteer opportunities to become a leader within the community.
  - Learn and apply to summer programs such as GSP/GSA/GSE. – minimum of 6 meetings.
  - Develop and implement a plan for standardized test prep – PSAT and ACT/SAT.
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## Seniors

**1 or 2 monthly meetings recommended – minimum 4 meetings**  
**\$175 per meeting**

- Develop a comprehensive college list.
  - Essay skill building – idea brainstorming, structure development, and revisions.
  - Application review – resume, activity list, volunteer hours, etc.
  - Explore career path interests.
  - Locate volunteer opportunities to become a leader within the community.
  - Finalize standardized test prep – ACT and/or SAT.
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
